

REGISTRATION AS A PHARMACY TECHNICIAN

Pharmacy Technicians registered in another Canadian jurisdiction

Interpretation Guide

Last Revised July 2025

In accordance with the *Pharmacy Act, 2024*¹, those who are currently registered as a pharmacy technician in another Canadian jurisdiction who wish to register with the College of Pharmacy of Newfoundland and Labrador (CPNL) as a pharmacy technician must complete the following requirements:

- Arrange to have Letters of Standing sent directly to CPNL from all pharmacy regulatory authorities with which they are currently, or were formerly, registered, in accordance with CPNL's <u>Letters of Standing Interpretation Guide</u>.
- Complete the CPNL Registration Examination, in accordance with CPNL's <u>Registration Examination Interpretation Guide</u>.
- Arrange to have a certificate of conduct sent <u>directly to CPNL</u> in accordance with CPNL's Certificate of Conduct Requirements for Registration.
- Apply to register as a pharmacy technician. This includes providing:
 - A professional liability insurance coverage certificate, indicating current coverage in accordance with CPNL's <u>Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration</u>; and
 - Government-issued photo identification in accordance with CPNL's <u>Photo Identification</u> <u>Requirements for Registration</u>.

Once the above steps have been completed and all documentation has been received, the applicant's file will be reviewed to ensure that all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador have been met. The applicant will be notified once a final decision has been made.

PLEASE NOTE:

Depending on the current province of registration, applicants may be required to demonstrate English language proficiency in accordance with CPNL's <u>English Language Proficiency</u> <u>Requirements for Registration</u>.
